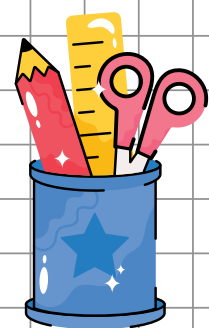
START PRE-K IN THE BEST WAY!

- 1.TALK, READ and SING! Enjoy time together sharing in the NEW school experience.
2. Create excitement and share enthusiasm with your child about starting school!
3. Follow a consistent daily routine with your child to help remember hygiene habits and chores (brush teeth, eat breakfast, make bed, prepare school supplies and clothes the night before bedtime).
4. Ask open-ended questions about their school experiences and wait for responses! Look at them at eye level. Acknowledge and validate their feelings and enjoy your time together.

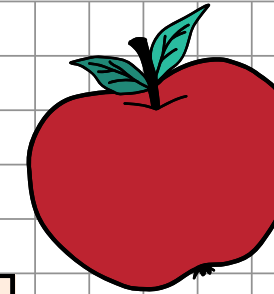

FAMILY TIME IS LEARNING FUN!

1. LISTEN and learn! Tweak those ears and develop listening skills by playing listening games with sounds from your phone to identify environmental sounds (ocean, lawnmower, dog barking...) Be Tricky to add to the FUN.
2. Letter recognition: The initial letter of a child's name is meaningful to them. Encourage them to identify their initials while you drive in your neighborhood. Invite them to draw letters in the air, use chalk or play dough, or shaving cream on the bathroom mirror! Make it fun to recognize other letters too!
3. Count everything with your child: fruits, vegetables, cars, candy, socks, toys, flowers. Tap with your finger for one-to-one correspondence.

Cozy up and read silly stories with your child.
Choose books based on your child's interests.

Play rhyming games.

Ask questions you don't know the answers to.

Talk about the illustrations... ask "what do you think is going to happen next?"

(read the book and recreate the story together using words such as: "over," "under," "through."

3. Engage in picture "walk-talks by having your child "read" the picture and "talk" about what they see!

GOBBLE, GOBBLE AND GROWING!

1. Cook with your child. Practice following 2-3 step directions, "please go get the wooden spoon, then pour the mix in the bowl, then stir the mix."
2. Go on a nature walk and collect various leaves, rocks, acorns, and sticks, etc. and create repetitive art patterns. Look for shapes and patterns in the clouds.
3. Help your child take responsibility: clean up mess, pick their own snacks, clothes, and PJ's. Let them dress independently and complete house chores. This helps to build self-esteem. Praise them specifically for these admirable moments.

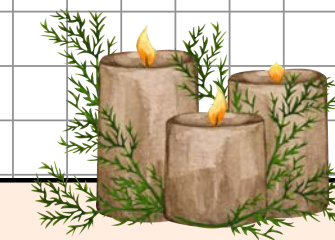

PLAYING AND PRETENDING

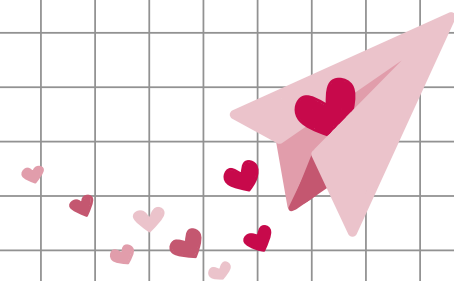
1. Role Play with your child. Pretend play you are a customer at a beauty salon, store, restaurant and provide materials, menus, flyers, stuffed animals, and dress up clothes to help your child express themselves. Use vocabulary that is familiar and new to encourage the use of new words.

2. Use nursery rhymes, fingerplays, songs and poetry to help learn and distinguish sounds, understand, and create rhymes, and learn new words.

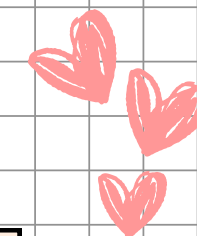

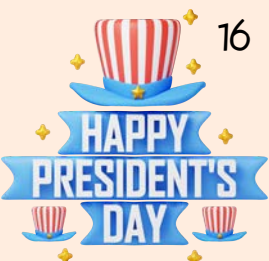

LOVE AND LETTERS!



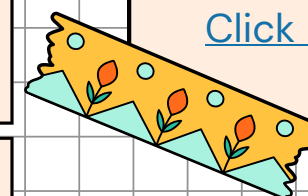
1. Go on a letter hunt! Identify letters at home in the pantry and household items. Discuss them, "Who else has that letter?" "S is for Sam and Soup"

2. February is a perfect month for LOVE notes! Provide writing materials, stationery, stickers, and opportunities to write messages. Your child can also help write shopping and "to do" lists and label items around the home for FUN! They can also send text messages to Grandma or Daddy.

3. Have a consistent location for drawing. Ask your child to tell you about their drawing and encourage them to write "in their own way" and "read it to you" when describing their drawing.

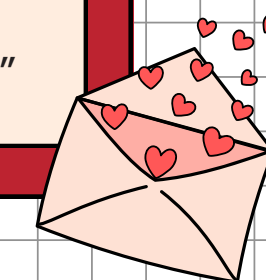

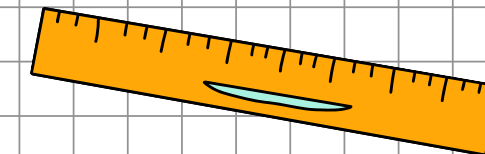
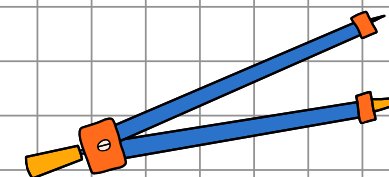

ROCKS 'N' ENROLLS!

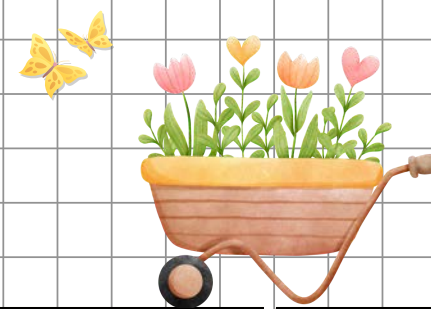
1. Let's talk size! Measure and record using nonstandard tools like paper clips, thumb prints, yarn, rope, "post its," utensils to measure objects and compare sizes. Practice counting skills and use words like tall, small, length, shorter, longer... Together create a graph of your data.

2. Categories and Classification! Go into the closet and order shoes, neckties, socks, hats, and handbags by color, size, type, etc. You can seriate by size too. Create crazy categories for FUN!

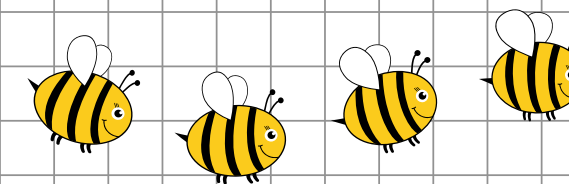
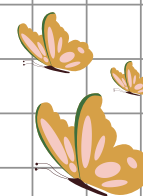

SPRING SOUNDS AND SYLLABLES!

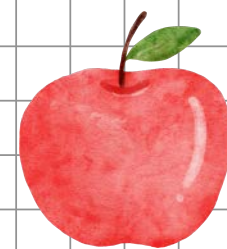
1. Compound Word Wandering! Wander around the house and find compound words. Use two blocks/Legos to represent the two words ex: bathtub, bookcase, dishwasher, cupcake, basketball. Ask: "what two words make this word?" Use two blocks by putting them together to show how a compound word is made of two words they know.

2. In the car, play "I SPY." Spy and say a word and count how many syllables are in that word. For example: restaurant (3), parking (2), cafeteria (5), store (1), market (2). Teach your child to count SYLLABLES by putting your hand under your chin and say the word and count how many times your jaw drops.

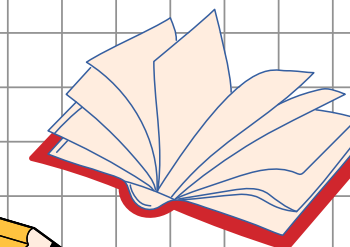
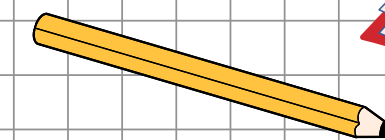

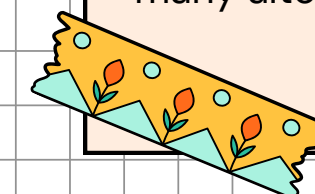
PROUD PROGRESS!



1. Kindergarten is almost here! Reinforce social and emotional skills by supporting your child 's autonomy. Praise your child for picking clothes, dressing independently, brushing teeth, doing errands and being responsible for toys and pets. This autonomy, self-esteem, independence, and responsibility will lead to success on their learning journey.

2. Onset-Rime Games for fun! Practice beginning and ending sounds of 1 syllable words (c-at/ b-at/ h-at/ m-at). Play together to recognize and discriminate familiar words, see spelling patterns, and identify meanings of words. This prepares, supports, and creates excitement for reading.

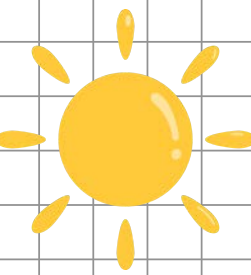
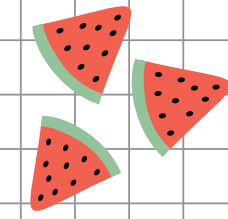
3. KEEP COUNTING! Count objects and take them away. Ask students: "How many do you have? Let's count! How many altogether? Where do you have more?"

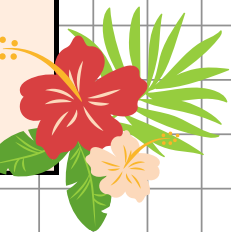
